OVERVIEW

Statements of Purpose:

A. Strategic Direction

These areas were obtained and are currently maintained primarily for wildfire detection purposes. The fire towers on these towersites are all likely eligible for listing on the National Register for Historic Places. The Houston and Cabool fire towers were erected in 1960 and the Summersville fire tower was erected in 1953.

This area is open to the public; however, the tower is closed to the public and the entrance road is barricaded.



Appendix 3. Houston Towersite Background




The tower is located inside the boundary of Gist Ranch Conservation Area.


Legal Description: Township 29 North, Range 08 West, Section 13.
